## Direct Instruction Pioneer Jean Osborn Passes



We are sorry to announce noted DI author and researcher Jean Osborn passed away at her home in Champaign, Illinois, on June 20 at the age of 91.

Jean began working with Siegfried "Zig" Engelmann at the University of Illinois in 1964. She worked with Zig, Carl Bereiter and a small team in the Bereiter-Engelmann preschool and developed what eventually became the DISTAR Language program. This was while raising 3 (eventually 4) children and pursuing a master's degree in education at the U of I. Jean also coauthored several levels of

Reading Mastery and the Corrective Reading Program. She wrote about her memories of the early days of DI for Zig's memorial service in 2019. <u>Click here</u> to access her recollections.

Jean was a project manager for Project Follow Through and helped train many teachers, coaches and consultants. Many educators in the field credit Jean with giving them training and encouragement to pursue their chosen profession. She was a kind, compassionate person, who made those around her feel comfortable and confident in their abilities.

She went on to become a researcher at the U of I's Center for the Study of Reading, later serving as the center's associate director. She worked in Texas for then Governor George Bush and, when Bush became President, served on the advisory board for the National Institute for Literacy.
